Aid shipments to Ukraine continued.



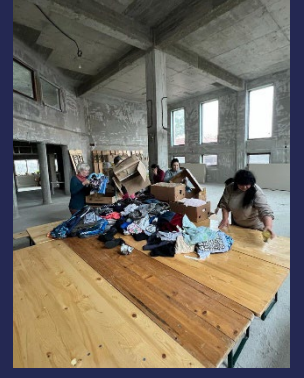

A 29-year-old woman, a refugee from Ukraine, gave birth to a baby boy at the maternity hospital in Botoșani, Romania. The young mother is from Kherson, a Ukrainian city hard-tested by struggles, where she was a ballerina. She took refuge in our country a few months ago.

According to the young mother, the child's father is 38 years old and a sailor. He is directly involved in the struggle for the liberation of the Ukrainian territories.

Through the involvement and care of the Mark Master Brothers, the mother and child have a separate room at the Refugee Center, with all the necessary things. The birth of this child in peaceful conditions generates hope in the entire refugee community, but also immense joy.
